Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to

pray. ²⁹And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white.

³⁰Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. ³¹They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. ³²Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. ³³Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' The Eucharistic Prayer (E)

The Lord is here.

always and everywhere to give you
thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal

For on this day he revealed his glory
before his chosen witnesses
and filled with divine splendour
the human flesh in which he is one with
us. So he prepared his disciples
to bear the scandal of the cross
and showed that in the Church, his
body, the same glory would be fulfilled
that shone forth from him, its head.
And so with joyful hearts we echo on
earth the song of the angels in heaven
as they praise your glory without end:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are
full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the
name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

We praise and bless you, loving Father,
through Jesus Christ, our Lord;
and as we obey his command,
send your Holy Spirit,

that broken bread and wine outpoured
may be for us the body and blood of
your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had
supper with his friends and,
taking bread, he praised you.

He broke the bread, gave it to them
and said:

Take, eat; this is my body which is
given for you;

do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took
the cup of wine.

Again he praised you, gave it to them
and said:

Drink this, all of you;

this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many for
the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in
remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus
did, in him we plead with confidence his
sacrifice made once for all
upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life
and cup of salvation,
we proclaim his death and resurrection
until he comes in glory.

Praise to you Lord Jesus:

**Dying you destroyed our death,
rising you restored our life:
Lord Jesus, come in glory.**

Lord of all life,

help us to work together for that day
when your kingdom comes and justice
and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people,
gather us in your loving arms and bring
us with St Matthew and all the saints to
feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever. Amen.
