Advent Ring

The Advent Candle will be lit at this point in the service.

Advent Sunday: the candle for the whole people of God, the candle of Hope

Prayer: God of Abraham and Sarah, and all the patriarchs of old, you are our Father too. Your love is revealed to us in Jesus Christ, Son of God and Son of David. Help us in preparing to celebrate his birth to make our hearts ready for your Holy Spirit to make his home among us. We ask this through Jesus Christ, the light who is coming into the world.

Lord Jesus, light of the world, born in David's city of Bethlehem, born like him to be a King: Be born in our hearts this Christmas, be king of our lives today. Amen

Prayers of Penitence

The prayers are introduced with these or other seasonal words:

Christ the Light of the world has come to dispel the darkness of our hearts. In his light let us examine ourselves and confess our sins.

Most merciful God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we confess that we have sinned in thought, word and deed.

We have not loved you with our whole heart. We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. In your mercy forgive what we have been, help us to amend what we are, and direct what we shall be; that we may do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with you, our God. Amen.

The president declares God's forgiveness.

The Collect

A period of silent prayer is held, then the President prays the Collect of the Day. At the end all respond, Amen

The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

At the end the reader says
This is the word of the Lord
Thanks be to God

Our children leave for Young Church after the first reading.

Second Reading

At the end the reader says
This is the word of the Lord
Thanks be to God

The Gospel Reading

The Gospel Acclamation is sung by the choir

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

The Eucharistic Prayer

*(from the First Sunday of Advent until
8th December)*

The Lord be with you
And also with you

Lift up your hearts

We lift them to the Lord

Let us give thanks to the Lord our
God

**It is right to give thanks and
praise**

It is indeed right and good to give
you thanks and praise, almighty God
and everlasting Father,
through Jesus Christ your Son.

For when he humbled himself to
come among us in human flesh,
he fulfilled the plan you formed
before the foundation of the world
to open for us the way of salvation.
Confident that your promise will be
fulfilled, we now watch for the day
when Christ our Lord will come
again in glory.

And so we join our voices with
angels and archangels
and with all the company of heaven

to proclaim your glory
for ever praising you and singing:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of
your glory.**

Hosanna in the highest.

**[Blessed is he who comes in
the name of the Lord.**

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source
of all holiness; grant that by the
power of your Holy Spirit,
and according to your holy will,
these gifts of bread and wine
may be to us the body and blood of
our Lord Jesus Christ; who, in the
same night that he was betrayed,
took bread and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to his
disciples, saying:

Take, eat; this is my body which is
given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper
he took the cup and gave you thanks;
he gave it to them, saying:

Drink this, all of you;

this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as
often as you drink it,
in remembrance of me.

Praise to you, Lord Jesus:

**Dying you destroyed our
death,**

**rising you restored our life:
Lord Jesus, come in glory.**

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup,

so that we, in the company of St Matthew and all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom,

in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

Amen.

As the children return from Young Church we sing:

For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours
now and for ever. Amen.**

Breaking of the Bread

Every time we eat this bread and drink this cup,

**we proclaim the Lord's death
until he comes.**

Agnus Dei

**Jesus, Lamb of God,
have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, bearer of our sins,
have mercy on us**

**Jesus, redeemer of the world,
give us your peace.**

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

Giving of Communion

The president invites the people to receive communion. During communion, the choir may sing an anthem.
