Advent Ring

The Advent Candle will be lit at this point in the service.

Advent 4: the candle for Mary, the candle of Joy.

Prayer: God our Father, the angel Gabriel told the Virgin Mary that she was to be the mother of your Son. Though Mary was afraid, she responded to your call with joy. Help us, whom you call to serve you, to share like her in your great work of bringing to our world your love and healing. We ask this through Jesus Christ, the light who is coming into the world.

Lord Jesus, Light of the world, blessed is Gabriel who brought good news; blessed is Mary your mother and ours. Bless your Church preparing for Christmas; and bless us your children, who long for your coming. Amen

Prayers of Penitence

The prayers are introduced with these or other seasonal words:

Christ the Light of the world has come to dispel the darkness of our hearts. In his light let us examine ourselves and confess our sins.

**Most merciful God,
Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
we confess that we have sinned**

**in thought, word and deed.
We have not loved you with our whole heart. We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. In your mercy forgive what we have been, help us to amend what we are,
and direct what we shall be;
that we may do justly,
love mercy,
and walk humbly with you,
our God. Amen.**

The president declares God's forgiveness.

The Collect

A period of silent prayer is held, then the President prays the Collect of the Day. At the end all respond, Amen

The Gospel Reading

The Gospel Acclamation is sung by the choir

Blessed be God,

The Eucharistic Prayer

(from 15th December until Christmas Eve)

The Lord be with you
and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right and good to give you thanks and praise, almighty God and everlasting Father,

through Jesus Christ your Son.

He is the one foretold by all the prophets,

whom the Virgin Mother bore with love beyond all telling. John the Baptist was his herald

and made him known when at last he came.

In his love Christ fills us with joy as we prepare to celebrate his birth, so that when he comes again he may find us watching in prayer, our hearts filled with wonder and praise.

And so, with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your glory,

and join in their unending hymn of praise:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of
your glory.**

Hosanna in the highest.

**[Blessed is he who comes in
the name of the Lord.**

We praise and bless you, loving Father,

through Jesus Christ, our Lord;

and as we obey his command,

send your Holy Spirit,

that broken bread and wine

outpoured

may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you.

He broke the bread, gave it to them and said:

Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;

do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you;

this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that
Jesus did,
in him we plead with confidence his
sacrifice
made once for all upon the cross.
Bringing before you the bread of life
and cup of salvation, we proclaim his
death and resurrection
until he comes in glory.

Christ is the bread of life:
When we eat this bread and drink
this cup, we proclaim your death,
Lord Jesus,
until you come in glory.

Lord of all life,
help us to work together for that day
when your kingdom comes
and justice and mercy will be seen in
all the earth. Look with favour on
your people,
gather us in your loving arms
and bring us with St Matthew all the
saints
to feast at your table in heaven.
Through Christ, and with Christ, and
in Christ, in the unity of the Holy
Spirit,
all honour and glory are yours, O
loving Father, for ever and ever.

Breaking of the Bread

Every time we eat this bread and
drink this cup,
**we proclaim the Lord's death
until he comes.**

Agnus Dei

have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, bearer of our sins,
have mercy on us**

**Jesus, redeemer of the world,
give us your peace.**

Jesus is the Lamb of God
who takes away the sin of the world.
Blessed are those who are called to
his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

The president invites the people to receive communion. During communion, the choir may sing an anthem.
